

Certificate in Fire Safety Management

Two Intakes annually in February and September

1. Course Aims and Objective

Fire safety management is crucial to the overall safety of a building. For many new buildings, it has been incorporated in the design in like manner as other fire safety provisions and, sometimes, as part and parcel of the "fire engineering approach" with the objectives clearly stated in a fire safety manual. For existing buildings, it becomes particularly important as both active and passive fire protections therein may be inadequate compared with the present standards and have to be fully re-evaluated and, where necessary, upgraded in accordance with current statutory protection measures of the building, to prove due diligence of the building owner and to provide an optimal level of public safety.

Against such background, the Certificate Course in Fire Safety Management is developed and designed to assist building/facility managers and engineers to gain a deeper understanding of the properties of fire and the importance of its prevention as well as to cope with the existing need for improving fire safety in various buildings. This course provides practical knowledge on the identification of fire hazards and the proper management of fire protection systems, both active and passive. An overview of the legal requirements on fire safety is also included in the program. Upon completion of the training, participants will be able to draw up a site specific Fire Safety Plan for their workplace and to implement all fire safety measures as prescribed in the Plan methodically and systematically.

2. Target Groups

Professionals of building architect, building/facility managers, site engineers, safety managers, safety officers / auditors, security managers, industrial entrepreneurs and any person who wants to acquire the necessary knowledge in fire safety management **within a short period of time**, will find the course very practical and useful.

3. Course Contents

Module 1 Fire Safety Legislation in Hong Kong

Common provisions of the legislation related to fire safety will be extracted and delivered. Lectures will focus on practical application of the relevant legislation mainly about provision and maintenance of fire service installations, fireman's lift, emergency vehicular access, types and abatement of fire hazard, improvement to fire safety measures in old buildings etc.

Module 2 Fire Service Installations and Means of Access

Introduction on Fire Service Installations (FSI) in buildings of various types and buildings under construction as required by HKFSD's Codes of Practice will be made. Legal requirements and the adoption of engineering approaches for the provision of FSI in buildings of special design will be discussed. Functions and uses of various common building FSI as well as the registered FSI contractors scheme will also be covered. Furthermore, requirements about Means of Access including fireman's lift, firefighting and rescue stairway and emergency vehicular access as stipulated in the Code of Practice for Fire Safety in

Buildings 2011 will also be discussed.

Module 3 Fire Science and Safety in Buildings

Chemistry of fire, methods of extinguishment, flame types, combustibles burning characteristics, flammability of fuel, fire plume characteristics and flame spread on fuel surfaces will be introduced. Fire behaviour in compartments and the factors that affect the development, smoke movement and toxicity, and the occupants' respond during fire emergency will be discussed.

Module 4 Building Regulations on Fire Safety

Code of Practice on Means of Escape, use of building materials in building construction, fire resisting construction including compartmentation in buildings of various types in accordance with the Building Legislation will be extracted and delivered. Additions and Alterations for building modifications at various stages of building works will be elaborated. Legal requirement on unauthorized building works will also be covered.

Module 5 Emergency Planning and Fire Safety Plan

Emergency planning in buildings and occupancies of various types and building under construction; fire drills and emergency evacuation procedures; fire safety management in buildings of various types and buildings under construction will be discussed; drafting and implementation of fire safety plan for buildings of various types including various elements of the fire safety management, such as safety policy, audit of resources, emergency fire organization, training of staff, safety promotion, safety inspections and all fire safety equipment maintenance etc. will be delivered.

4. Speakers

Ir Ng Bong Loy, BEng(Hons), MPA, RPE(Fire), MHKIE, MIFIRE - Ir Ng is a retired Chief Fire Officer of the Fire Services Department. With his 37 years working experience as a fire officer, Ir Ng has all-round knowledge and extremely rich experience and professionalism in fire safety management, fire protection requirements, firefighting and rescue operations etc. Ir Ng also has a solid grasp of fire engineering knowledge and applications. He is at present a Registered Professional Engineer (fire), member of the Hong Kong Institution of Engineers (Fire) and the Institution of Fire Engineers as well.

Ir Lam Man Yiu, BEng(Hons), MSc, MIFireE - Ir Lam has 30 years of practical fire-fighting and fire safety law enforcement experiences and retired from the local fire department for about two years. He had also acquired international experience from being a firefighter in the Fire Department of the City of Toronto, Ontario of Canada for 10 years. During his stay in Canada, he had participated in promoting fire professionalism as a founding member of the Canada Branch of the Institution of Fire Engineers. Ir Lam is presently a Chartered Fire Engineer of the Institution of Fire Engineers, UK and currently engaged in teaching fire science subjects at tertiary level.

Mr Lawrence HO - PostGrad OSH Management, RSO, RSA, CMIOSH, MIFE – Mr Law served in the Hong Kong Fire Services Department for 25 year up to the rank of Divisional Officer, Commandant, Fire Services Training School responsible for the training of various aspects including fire safety, fire prevention, fire-fighting and law enforcement of all fire safety issues. The 10 years servicer s in HSBC as head of occupational safety and health, responsible for the development of employee related fire and OSH

policies, implementation and control of all matters in relation to fire safety, health, environment and staff well being in the area of Asia-Pacific. In the last 8 years as fire and safety consultant taking up tasks in various government projects in MTR, Housing Authority and other construction projects. Lawrence is the Founding Chairman and Chairman of the Institute of Safety and Health Practitioners until 2014 and Chartered member of Institute of Occupational Safety and Health (UK) and the Global Partner of the Robert Campbell Award, National Safety Council (USA). Lawrence is a Registered Safety Officer, Registered Safety Auditor and Registered Safety Consultant. Currently Lawrence has put forward great effort in promoting Fire Safety Management Training Program in collaboration with the China Hong Kong Fire Protection Association and the Institute of Safety and Health Practitioners.

Ir Yan Kin Chung, BEng(Hons), CEng, MHKIE, FIFireE - Ir Yan has more than 30 years of experience in fire profession. He is a retired Assistant Divisional Officer of the Hong Kong Fire Services Department. He was a council member of the Institution of Fire Engineers (Hong Kong Branch) from 2001 and kept on serving until retired from the Branch in 2013. Besides, he was a founding member of the fire division in Hong Kong Institution of Engineers. Ir Yan started his engineering profession as an electrical engineer in early 80s' to join in MTRC Island Line project which, amongst others, involved works in fire engineering. During his career in the local Fire Department, he was posted to different echelons for a variety of duties in firefighting, fire investigation, fire protection, control and mobilization of fire engines and ambulances to operational incidents, and management of information technology projects. Ir Yan teaches in a local tertiary education institute in the field of fire safety engineering.

Note: The above speakers will take up the major parts of the training program. Prof Andrew Wong will take up the advisory capacity for all Fire Safety Plan assignment submissions.

Program Principal Advisor:

Mr Kwok Jing Keung, Joe, SBS, FSDSM, CPM, Hon FIFireE, Hon F(UClan) - Mr Kwok joined the Hong Kong Fire Services Department (HKFSD) as an Assistant Station Officer in 1971. He retired in 2007 in the capacity of Director of Fire Services after serving the Department for over 36 years. Throughout his career, he had undertaken various duties including firefighting and rescue, fire prevention, investigations, training and administration. With the experience he had amassed over the years and the positions he had held, he was able to make significant contributions towards the improvement of fire safety in the community and the development of fire engineering profession in Hong Kong.

In addition to his official duties at HKFSD, Mr. Kwok had also been actively involved in the work of the Institution of Fire Engineers (Hong Kong Branch) and was elected the President thrice in 1996/1997 and 2005/2007. In 2008, Mr Kwok, in collaboration with a group of people who shared his vision, established the China Hong Kong Fire Protection Association for the purposes, among others, of providing a platform for fire professionals to work together to promote fire safety in Hong Kong as well as strengthening ties and cooperation with their mainland and overseas counterparts in their incessant pursuit of further development in the fields of fire engineering and fire science. At present, he is the President of the Association.

Professor WONG was the Founding President of The Institution of Fire Engineers Canada Branch and the first recipient of the Companion Fellow title amongst the world-wide membership of the Institution of Fire Engineers. He is one of the Founding Directors of the Ontario Fire Marshal's Public Fire Safety Council. He has been Senior Divisional Officer of the Hong Kong Fire Services Department and also an Executive Officer (Fire Protection Specialist) of the City of Vaughan Fire and Rescue Service in Ontario, Canada. Andrew was a Professor of the Toronto-based Seneca College of Applied Arts and Technology for over 17 years. He was instrumental in teaching certificate courses in Fire Safety Planning in Canada.

Andrew is a Registered Designer (Fire Protection) with the Ontario Ministry of Municipal Affairs and Housing, and a Certified Fire Prevention Officer with the Ontario Ministry of Community Safety and Correctional Services. He is a Professional Member of the American Society of Safety Engineers and a Professional Member of the International Coach Federation. He is also a Certified Fire and Explosion Investigator and Instructor. His Canada-based consulting company is specialized in preparing site-specific fire safety plans for various occupancies and training of staff in the implementation of fire safety plans.

Mr Li Hung Sum, Albert, BEng(Hons), FIFireE, Hon F(UClan), After serving in a private firm as an assistant electric engineer for one year, Mr Li joined the public service and worked in the Hong Kong Fire Services Department (HKFSD) in 1979 and retired in 2010.
